Kinders bogemiddeld danksy moedertaal

More (Vrydag 21 Februarie) is Internasionale Moedertaaldag en daarom is moedertaalonderrig opnuut op almal se lippe.

Dis 'n feit: Moedertaal is jou sleutel tot uitnemendheid en om onderrig in jou moedertaal te ontvang, laat jou bo die gemiddelde uitstyg en gee jou die vermoë om saam met die bestes in die wêreld te praat.

Trouens, jou moedertaal verbind jou aan jou kultuur en menswees – dit maak jou wie jy is. Dit is jou identiteit sodat jy die wêreld met selfvertroue in die oë kan kyk.

Nog belangriker: In ons samelewing is dit deesdae 'n feit dat kinders Engels sal aanleer, kom wat wil, maar dis net 'n ouer (en grootouers) wat 'n kind sy moedertaal kan leer. En sodra jou kind sy moedertaal behoorlik onder die knie het, leer hy 'n tweede en derde taal heelwat makliker aan. Met jou toewyding help jy jou kind dus om meertalig te wees!

Al hoe meer ouers wonder of dit nog sinvol is om hul kinders in hul moedertaal te laat skoolgaan as tersiêre instellings in die ekonomiese wêreld nie net internasionaal nie, maar ook plaaslik, Engels as voertaal gebruik. Akademici en taalaktiviste is dit egter eens: Mense word deur hul moedertaal bemagtig. Kinders het hul moedertaal nodig om hul kognitiewe ontwikkeling te verseker.

Kinders leer makliker in hul moedertaal lees en skryf. Skryf is 'n tegniese aktiwiteit waardeur taal uitgedruk word en anders as gesproke taal, ontwikkel dit nie spontaan nie.

Dit is baie makliker vir kinders wat in hul moedertaal leer lees en skryf om die verbintenis tussen gesproke en geskrewe taal te vorm. As jy leer lees het in 'n taal wat vir jou maklik is, is dit soveel makliker om konsepte en vaardighede in 'n tweede of derde taal oor te dra. Byvoorbeeld, as 'n kind in Afrikaans tydkonsepte leer, hoef hy nie

weer die totale tydsbegrip in Engels te leer nie, maar slegs die Engelse woorde – hy het reeds die intellektuele basis en begrip. Ander intellektuele begrippe soos oorsaak en gevolg of om tussen hoofgedagtes en ondersteunende detail te onderskei, word gemaklik uit die moedertaal na 'n tweede taal oorgedra.

NOTIFICATION OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT PROCESS:
PROPOSED DUALLING OF MAIN ROAD 201 (R301), PAARL, WESTERN CAPE.

Project Description: The Western Cape Government: Department of Transport and Public Works (applicant) proposes the dualling of Main Road (MR) 201 from approximately 150 metres south of the N1 to approximately 320 metres south of Kliprug Minor Road (access to Val de Vie). A number of access points to the MR201 also forms part of the proposed development, which also entails the realignment of some of the existing accesses. It is proposed that the road reserve support a width of 30 metres. A total of 27 culverts will be upgraded (length of culverts to be increased). As such, SAS Consulting was appointed to conduct a Watercourse Assessment of the proposed development. Additionally, areas of sensitive natural vegetation were identified in the existing road reserve and new proposed construction footprint. Therefore, a Botanical Assessment was conducted by Dr Dave McDonald. Rehabilitation of the natural vegetation and wetland areas to be impacted on is proposed, which will be conducted in line with the relevant rehabilitation plans which is currently being drafted. Application is also made for a Water Use Licence (WUL) in terms of Section 21 (c) and (i) of the National Water Act, 1998 (Act 36 of 1998). The WUL application is necessitated as a result of the proposed construction activities to take place within watercourses and wetlands. Application in terms of the National Environmental Management Act (Act 107 of 1998), will be made for the following activities: Listing Notice 1 (GN No. R. 327) Activities 12, 19, 48 & 56; and Listing Notice 3 (GN No. R. 324) Activities 12 & 18.

Locality: The dualling of MR201 is proposed from approximately 150 metres south of the N1 to approximately 320 metres south of Kliprug Minor Road (access to Val de Vie).
